Congratulations to all the 29 finalists that included our very own CABBI member, **Grace Paleg!** Also, CABBI members Carleta Delac and Dave Ramsland were in the final selection of hundreds of paintings submitted. The biennial Acquisitive Award of \$25,000 went to Lexie Watt's beautiful drawing with water colour called Wind blown Trees Bumbo Headland 2024. It is well worth visiting this Exhibition. Our Exhibition opens in less than three weeks!

Everything is on track for a great event. The dates of each stage of the Exhibition are in the calendar above. Note that this year we are holding an Opening of the Exhibition before we open the doors to the public.

- We have a very good listing of entries with a spread through all categories. Garry is now cataloging entries and fine tuning their management through the exhibition timetable. He would also like to remind entrants of the following:
 - **Deliver** your entry, including 9x5 pieces, **9.30-11.30am on 31st December.**
 - Pick up your entry 1-2pm on 20th January
 - Make sure your entry has an information tag on the back
 - Check your bank statement to confirm your fees are correct and paid
 - Be sure of your roster duty days/times
- There has been a lot of interest in the 9x5 category. The board supply from the Gallery is exhausted but there is still plenty of time, right up to 31st, to make your own board and create an entry.
- Our President has single handedly gained a suite of willing sponsors from local businesses. The advertising of our 2025 sponsors will shortly begin.
- Arrangements for the Exhibition Opening Ceremony are being finalised. Fiona Phillips MP will open the Exhibition. Our ESC Mayor, Matt Hatcher will also be in attendance. You will have received your personal invitation per email. Don't forget to also invite your family and friends.



- The roster of volunteers to run the daily shifts of the exhibition has been distributed.
- The furniture renovation program is nearing completion.
- It is not too late to volunteer your help. In particular, once I have some more accurate timings, I will be asking for able bodied assistants to move the panels and lights into position on the morning of 30th Dec. Wait for the email closer to the day. And, of course, help will be needed on the day of pack up, 20th January.

From now, until 20th January, we need your help in publicising the event. Bearing in mind that the Batemans Bay southern shortcut now diverts traffic away from the High School area, we now rely on prospective visitors knowing, by all sorts of methods, when and where the exhibition is on.

We can no longer rely on a chance "drive by" of visitors seeing the signage at the High School.

You can help by:

- Distributing the previously emailed electronic copy of the flyer to your friends, relatives, social clubs, workmates etc, directly or by social media
- o Printing a copy of the flyer and posting it on your local community notice board
- Grabbing a bunch of flyers from the stocks held at the Gallery, Mogo, and doing a letterbox drop, preferably by suburb. If you do, please contact me first, secretary@cabbi.com.au so I can track where these are going. It avoids others doubling up on the effort and I can also target resulting "holes" in the landscape. So far, the following areas have been covered: Batemans Bay township, Mogo, Rosedale.
- Please keep the effort going right through to the 20th January.

In summary, the Exhibition is shaping up to be a good one, a significant event on the South Coast art calendar. It is your show, your chance to display the very best of CABBI talent. Hopefully, it will also be a commercial success for you, and for CABBI. The CABBI Management Committee looks forward to seeing you at the Opening.

For the past two weeks, we have been concentrating on the 9 x 5 exhibition. We have officially closed for 2024 and plan to reconvene on February 7 2025.




